

Our New Model of LLC: LLC-CP

- Academic Component:
 - 2-year, 4-semester sequential linking of 4 courses
 - Courses are built into student current curriculum
 - Weekly .5 credit co-curricular "lab"
 - Mid-career, transcripted credential

Scientific Communication

- Semester #1: Science Lab
- Semester #2: Critical Thinking
- Semester #3: Statistics
- Semester #4: Research Writing

Global Scholarship

- Semester #1: Cultural Anthropology
- Semester #2: Global History
- Semester #3: Presentation Making
- Semester #4: Research Writing

Curriculum for 2 Pilots of LLC-CPs

Our New Model of LLC: LLC-CP

• Residential Component:

- Students will be co-located in designated floors
- Students can pick their own roommates
- Co-curricular requirements will address the student learning outcomes of the certificate program
- Intentional training for faculty and student affairs staff to support the certificate program
- Peer mentors for each program



Assessment Plan

- Student retention and persistence
- Each LLC-CP has its own set of expected student learning outcomes

Elements of Process

Administrative buy-in, funding – how to sell (Retention, recruitment, housing contracts, etc.)

Curricular development – importance of being budget/complement neutral, flexibility, sustainability. Template development.

Faculty partnership

Professional Development & Partnership with CTE – Teaching Circle, webinars, workshops

Partnership with Registrar, Marketing, Admissions, Orientation, etc.
